

Organic Farming through Vermi-composting

"I was introduced to vermi-composting a couple of years ago. I have three buffalo, so had plenty of dung to use in my two pits, which are 8' x 4' and 18" deep each. After filling my pit with buffalo dung, I watered it to make it moist, then purchased some worms from a friend. I then covered it and waited for 60-days. I was amazed at how the dung had changed into a friable organic compost.

At the beginning, I used to sell all the compost I made, but then began to use it myself. At the time, I used chemical fertilizer on my fields, but found that the more compost I used, the less fertilizer I needed. This year, I'm cutting out fertilizer completely, and just using my own compost.

For any farmer who has buffalo or cow dung, organic farmer through vermi-composting is great.



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
